



Grain Delivery Instructions

Best Practices for a Smooth Delivery Experience

01

YOUR RESPONSIBILITY

It is your responsibility (or your hauler's) to clearly communicate instructions to the scale operator at the time of delivery.

You **MUST** tell the scale operator if:

- The load should be **applied to a contract**, OR
- The load should be applied to **Grain Bank or Storage**, OR
- The load should be **spotted (current cash price or closing price)**

If no instruction is given:

- The load will automatically be placed into **open storage**
- Storage charges for grain placed into open storage are waived if grain is sold within 10 days of delivery. This is our current policy but is subject to change.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR ON YOUR SCALE TICKET

Before leaving the facility, always review your scale ticket carefully.

Confirm the following:

- Customer Name & Account
- Commodity & Bushels
- Grade Factors
- Purchase Class

Purchase Class Definitions:

When you deliver grain, each load is assigned a purchase class. This determines how that grain is handled and priced.

Basis Fixed- bushels applied to a basis contract.

Cash- bushels sold for cash across the scale.

Condo Storage-Unpriced bushels placed into the customer's condo storage

ETD-Bushels will be sold Sunday night during the market open at our posted Spot bid

Fixed Price- Bushels applied to a fixed price contract.

Futures/Cash- Bushels applied to a Futures/cash contract

Grain Bank- Bushels held in the grain bank storage program

Open Storage- Bushels are unpriced, awaiting direction. If no directions are provided within 10 days, the load will accrue storage charges.

FOLLOW-UP & COMMUNICATION

- Our team reviews all **Spots** and **Open storage** bushels daily.
- A Grain Marketing Advisor may contact you to discuss pricing or next steps.

- **Double-check your scale ticket before leaving**
- Reach out promptly if something doesn't look correct

Purchase Class Definitions

- Basis Fixed** – Bushels applied to a basis contract.
- Cash** – Bushels sold for cash across the scale.
- Condo Storage** – Unpriced bushels placed into customer's condo storage.
- ETD** – Bushels will be sold Sunday night during market open at the posted spot bid.
- Fixed Price** – Bushels applied to fixed price contract.
- Futures/Cash** – Bushels applied to a futures/cash contract.
- Grain Bank** – Bushels held in grain bank program.
- Open Storage** – Bushels are unpriced awaiting direction. If no directions are provided within 10 days, load will accrue storage charges.
